### **ORDER FOR CLOSURE OF RESTAURANTS AND LIQUOR LICENSED ESTABLISHMENTS**

Pursuant to Village of Oak Park Resolution 20-120 dated March 13, 2020, the Oak Park Village Board has declared an emergency affecting the public health due to the outbreak of the COVID-19 disease pursuant to Section 8-10-5 of the Illinois Municipal Code, 65 ILCS 5/8-10-5, and Sections 2-6-10, 2-27-9 and 20-1-6(Z) of the Village Code. Pursuant to the Resolution, the Village's Public Health Director has the authority to make "reasonable rules, regulations and orders . . . as may from time to time be deemed necessary for the preservation and improvement of the public health and for the suppression of disease."

#### **ORDER**

The spread of COVID-19 is a rapidly evolving situation which may require further amendment to this ORDER for the Closure of Restaurants and Liquor Licensed Established.

#### **CLOSURE OF RESTAURANTS AND LIQUOR LICENSED ESTABLISHMENTS**

Following Executive Order 2020-07 issued by Illinois Governor JB Pritzker dated March 16, 2020, the Village of Oak Park informs all Village restaurants, grocery stores and on-site consumption liquor license establishments that offer food or beverages for on-premises consumption that they may must be suspend service for and may not permit on-premises consumption effective 9:00 p.m. on Monday, March 16, 2020 through 11:59 p.m. on Monday, March 30, 2020. Such businesses are permitted and are encouraged to serve food and beverages so that they may be consumed off-premises, as currently permitted by law, through means such as in-house delivery, third-party delivery, drive-through and curbside pick-up. In addition, customers may enter the premises to purchase food or beverages for carry-out. However, establishments offering food or beverages for carry-out, including food trucks, must ensure that they have an environment where patrons maintain adequate social distancing. Businesses located in hospitals are exempt from the requirements of this Order. Hotel restaurants may continue to provide room service and carry-out.
