COVID-19 Status Report Oak Park Village Board of Trustees

To: Village President and Village Board of Trustees

The memo is a means to share a brief summary of information regarding Village of Oak Park operational activities in response to COVID-19. In most cases, formal public guidance or employee guidance has been publicly disseminated via the Village website or Village social media channels.

New Public Health Guidance

Today, the Village of Oak Park Department of Public Health received notification of the following new COVID-19 cases:

Sunday May 17	4 Oak Park residents
Monday May 18	4 Oak Park residents

The above newly reported Oak Park cases are in their 20s to 50s. Excluding individuals for which street addresses are not yet determined, the State of Illinois reports a total of two-hundred and forty-nine (249) total Oak Park COVID-19 cases. It is important to note that as patient tracking and case follow-up occurs, individuals listed within the number of Oak Park cases reported may change depending on residency confirmation.

The Oak Park Department of Public Health is notified of positive tests as established by state and local public health protocol. Because of privacy laws, no additional information can be released about the individuals. It is noted, that privacy precludes location information regarding individuals tested to anyone other than Public Health Officials and First Responders.

The Oak Park Department of Public Health is working closely with officials from the Illinois Department of Public Health (IDPH), investigating and notifying anyone who may have had exposure to the individual who tested positive for COVID-19. Local public health officials, hospitals and first responders are following protocols consistent with the latest guidance from the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC).

Cases related to Long-Term Care and Assisted Living Facilities

Oak Park Public Health Director Mike Charley reported today the sixteenth and seventeenth death of an Oak Park resident believed to be related to the COVID-19 coronavirus. The fatalities were a male in his 80s and a female in her 80s. Both were residents of Oasis, 625 N. Harlem. The residents had earlier tested positive for the virus, but the final cause of death will be determined by the Cook County Medical Examiner. Director Charley expressed his sincere condolences to the residents' friends and families for the loss of their loved one.

Also, Public Health Director Charley reported that information related to cases for residents in Long-Term Care and Assisted Living Facilities today includes one new staff member of the Oasis has tested positive.
