**COVID-19 Status Report  
Oak Park Village Board of Trustees**

To: Village President and Village Board of Trustees

The memo is a means to share a brief summary of information regarding Village of Oak Park operational activities in response to COVID-19. In most cases, formal public guidance or employee guidance has been publicly disseminated via the Village website or Village social media channels.

**New Public Health Guidance**

Today, the Village of Oak Park Department of Public Health received notification of the following new COVID-19 cases: 2 Oak Park Residents whose age range from their 30s to 80s.

Excluding individuals for which street addresses are not yet determined, the State of Illinois reports a total of three-hundred and three (303) total Oak Park COVID-19 cases. It is important to note that as patient tracking and case follow-up occurs, individuals listed within the number of Oak Park cases reported may change depending on residency confirmation.

The Oak Park Department of Public Health is notified of positive tests as established by state and local public health protocol. Because of privacy laws, no additional information can be released about the individuals. It is noted, that privacy precludes location information regarding individuals tested to anyone other than Public Health Officials and First Responders.

The Oak Park Department of Public Health is working closely with officials from the Illinois Department of Public Health (IDPH), investigating and notifying anyone who may have had exposure to the individual who tested positive for COVID-19. Local public health officials, hospitals and first responders are following protocols consistent with the latest guidance from the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC).

**Cases related to Long-Term Care and Assisted Living Facilities**

The Oak Park Public Health Department reported no changes today related to Long-Term Care and Assisted Living Facilities.

### **Emergency Operations Center**

With the June 1, 2020 expiration of the Village Board's declaration of an emergency affecting public health as well as the June 8, 2020 expiration of the Village Board's authorization for the Village President to declare a local state of emergency and order a temporary curfew the Village Emergency Operating Center (EOC) activation level has been reduced to Level 3 - Partial Activation from the prior Level 2 – Full Activation which had been in place since April 7, 2020 which was 63 days. Prior to April 7, 2020, the EOC has been at a Level 3 – Partial Activation since March 13, 2020 which was 89 days ago.

### **Personal Protective Equipment (PPE)**

The Oak Park Public Health Department, as a Certified Public Health Department, has received a shipment of PPE from the Illinois Emergency Management Agency (IEMA). The items have been inventoried and allotted to the Village's public health and public safety needs, which are inclusive of supporting the Farmers Market and preparing for the Early Voting process which will occur this Fall. As part of the Village's response to the COVID-19 pandemic, the Village is delivering a limited supply of disposable masks to Oak Park licensed food establishments that are currently open. The Oak Park Public Health Department is asking that the masks be shared with employees and/or if applicable customers. As supplies are available, additional business sectors will be adding in coming days. The PPE is intended to provide businesses with a small supply in the event the encounter delivery delays of PPE through the open market.

Also, through the Village's public health supplies, today the Oak Park Public Health staff is also able to provide masks to residents testing positive for COVID-19 and Oak Park close-contacts. Arrangements are made as part of the contact tracing done by the Public Health staff.
