COVID-19 Status Report
Oak Park Village Board of Trustees

The memo is a means to share a brief summary of information regarding Village of Oak Park operational activities in response to COVID-19. In most cases, formal public guidance or employee guidance has been publicly disseminated via the Village website or Village social media channels.

During Phase 4 of Restore Illinois, this report is issued once per week, on Wednesdays.

New Public Health Guidance

The Village of Oak Park Department of Public Health received notification of the following new COVID-19 cases; since last reported on Wednesday July 1:

Additionally, Public Health Director Mike Charley reports that on July 2, 2020, the Illinois Department of Public Health (IDPH) re-assigned twelve COVID-19 cases from Cook County to the Village of Oak Park. These cases are from as early as March 2020 (see additional monthly data below). Follow-up on the cases shows that only one of the cases is still defined as "active" and this is the June 2020 case.


Excluding individuals for which street addresses are not yet determined, the State of Illinois reports a total of three-hundred and sixty-one (361) total Oak Park COVID-19 cases. It is important to note that as patient tracking and case follow-up occurs, individuals listed within the number of Oak Park cases reported may change depending on residency confirmation.

Oak Park Public Health Director Mike Charley reported today the twenty-sixth death of Oak Park resident believed to be related to the COVID-19 coronavirus. The fatality was a male in his 60s. The resident had earlier tested positive for the virus, but the final cause of death will be determined by the Cook County Medical Examiner. Director Charley expressed his sincere condolences to the resident's friends and family for the loss of their loved one.

The Oak Park Department of Public Health is notified of positive tests as established by state and local public health protocol. Because of privacy laws, no additional information can be released about the individuals. It is noted, that privacy precludes location information regarding individuals tested to anyone other than Public Health Officials and First Responders.

The Oak Park Department of Public Health is working closely with officials from the Illinois Department of Public Health (IDPH), investigating and notifying anyone who may have had exposure to the individual who tested positive for COVID-19. Local public health officials, hospitals and first responders are following protocols consistent with the latest guidance from the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC).

The 14 day rolling average for Oak Park to date shows a steady average of approximately 1.5 cases/day since early June.



Cases related to Long-Term Care and Assisted Living Facilities

Public Health Director Charley reports cases remain unchanged since Friday, June 26, 2020 – a twelve day period.
