## COVID-19 Status Report Oak Park Village Board of Trustees

To: Village President and Village Board of Trustees

The memo is a means to share a brief summary of information regarding Village of Oak Park operational activities in response to COVID-19. In most cases, formal public guidance or employee guidance has been publicly disseminated via the Village website or Village social media channels.

The issuance of the Status Reports will be increased to Mondays, Wednesdays and Fridays in response to the slight uptick during this past seven day period.

## New Public Health Guidance

The Village of Oak Park Department of Public Health received notification of the following new COVID-19 cases; since last reported:

Excluding individuals for which street addresses are not yet determined, the State of Illinois reports a total of six hundred eighty-four (684) total Oak Park COVID-19 cases. It is important to note that as patient tracking and case follow-up occurs, individuals listed within the number of Oak Park cases reported may change depending on residency confirmation.

The Oak Park Department of Public Health is notified of positive tests as established by state and local public health protocol. Because of privacy laws, no additional information can be released about the individuals. It is noted, that privacy precludes location information regarding individuals tested to anyone other than Public Health Officials and First Responders.

The Oak Park Department of Public Health is working closely with officials from the Illinois Department of Public Health (IDPH), investigating and notifying anyone who may have had exposure to the individual who tested positive for COVID-19. Local public health officials, hospitals and first responders are following protocols consistent with the latest guidance from the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC).

## Cases related to Long-Term Care and Assisted Living Facilities

Public Health Director Charley reports an update since the last report issued on Monday August 31, 2020 related to cases in Long-Term Care and Assisted Living Facilities.

## Additional Temporary Fee Reductions

On September 21, 2020, the Village Board approved additional temporary fee reductions for Alarm Registration, Multi-Family Rental License, Small Rental License and Condominium Services and Inspection Fees due to the ongoing economic impact of the COVID-19 pandemic.

The reduction is anticipated to reduce revenues in the in the General Fund by \$72,000. The revenue offsets the costs associated with inspections and administrative services. Those activities will continue to be conducted as the registrations, licensing and inspection are still required – however a fee will not be charged. While the Village is facing fiscal challenges due to the pandemic, the temporary fee reductions were undertaken in recognition of the ongoing economic impact to individuals/businesses in the community. As this is only a temporary reduction these fees will automatically revert back to their codified amounts again in Fiscal Year 2021 with next year's billing cycle.

## **Public Health Data**

Public Health Director Charley has shared the following data related to COVID-19.

"New cases per 100,000 People". This metric looks at the number of recent COVID-19 cases per 100,000 people to describe the potential number of people who are currently ill and may be infectious. This is the number of new cases reported by IDPH in the previous week. Calculated as a rate = [Village of Oak Park case count for 7 days] / [Village population] x100,000. The State is using this metric,


- Oak Park rate: 50/100,000


