MPC is working to support the construction of the McCook Reservoir Main Tunnel by encouraging the purchase of McCook quarry limestone aggregate from Vulcan Materials for Chicagoland area projects. MPC is requesting that Chicago and suburbs require the use of Vulcan Materials aggregate for contractors and community projects. Karen will conduct some research on Village projects, contractors and vendors and report back in January for the February meeting.
