DRAFT Meeting Minutes Transportation Commission Monday, April 25, 2016 Council Chambers – Village Hall

Call to Order and Roll Call

Chair Jack Chalabian called the meeting to order at 6:59 PM.

Present: Jack Chalabian, Kyle Eichenberger, Joel Schoenmeyer, Mark Patzloff, Craig

Chesney, Will Gillespie

Excused: Michael Stewart

Staff: Jill Juliano, Mike Koperniak, Mary Avinger

The floor was now opened to non-agenda public testimony.

Amir Missaghi of 517 S. Oak Park Ave. spoke about speeding traffic problems on Oak Park Ave. between Madison and Jackson. Mr. Missaghi stated a vehicle crashed into his house the previous weekend and he would like the Commission to suggest some measures to reduce speed in that area.

Non-agenda public testimony was closed out.

Approval of Tonight's Meeting Agenda

Commissioner Gillespie motioned to approve the agenda as presented and was seconded by Commissioner Eichenberger. The motion was approved by a unanimous voice vote.

Approval of the Draft March 14, 2016 Meeting Minutes

Commissioner Gillespie motioned to approve the draft March 14, 2016, Transportation Commission meeting minutes and was seconded by Commissioner Schoenmeyer. The motion was approved by a unanimous voice vote.

SECOND REVIEW OF PETITION TO UPGRADE TO ALL-WAY STOP SIGNS AT THE THOMAS AND LOMBARD INTERSECTION

Jill Juliano, Traffic Engineer of the Engineering Division of the Public Works Department, gave a presentation on a second review of the petition to upgrade to all-way stop signs at the Thomas and Lombard intersection.

Ms. Juliano began the presentation with a brief review of the petition process from October 2015 to present. She also spoke about the speed percentile for the

intersection and surrounding streets including information from a study on the amount vehicles that pass through the intersection on a typical day and a vehicle crash history report. Jill does not recommend all-way stop signs at the intersection and spoke about the Commission's recommendation from the January 2016 meeting but is seeking the Commission's current recommendation.

Commissioner Chesney asked if speeds are different between summer and winter. Jill responded that such information is not available.

Commissioner Patzloff asked if a pedestrian count was done and Jill responded one had not been taken.

Chair Chalabian asked if Whittier school was consulted about safe walking route through intersection and Jill responded no they were not. Chair Chalabian commented staff should accept all-way stop signs. He stated he doesn't see any evidence that stop signs won't work. Ms. Juliano explained rolling stop problems and drivers making up for lost time by speeding on exit.

Chair Chalabian stated this is the only intersection in the area that doesn't have north/south stop signs except at Taylor. Both Jill Juliano and Mike Koperniak explained alternating stop signs and the predictability for drivers so they know where to stop.

The floor was now opened for public testimony.

Philip Novak-Gottshall of 701 N. Lombard stated the main concern is pedestrian safety. He does not have children but is concerned about children crossing the intersection especially during arrival and dismissal times. Mr. Novak-Gottshall feels the off-set intersection causes problems and markings are not obvious. He also stated traffic volume seems heaviest on Lombard and east to Hayes and feels all-way stop signs would aid pedestrians.

Tony Banout of 738 N. Lombard stated he has three children in which two attend Whittier and spoke about his concerns over students walking through the intersection and how he doesn't want there to be an accident. Mr. Banout also stated that there seems to be an increase of children in recent years and that a pedestrian study should be done. He stated he would like the stop signs approved.

Lou Garapolo of 737 N Lombard stated he was at the previous meeting and thought that in-street pedestrian signs were a good compromise but disappointed they will not be installed. He recommends installing the all-way stop signs and coming back in six months to see what happens.

Matt Stolfa of 624 N Harvey stated that he used to live at 735 N. Lombard and the off-set intersection causes driver uncertainty. He also stated there is more speeding during school arrival and dismissal times and supports all-way stop signs.

Keith Jenkins of 726 N. Lombard stated he has lived there ten years and hayoung son attending Whittier that he walks to school. Mr. Jenkins stated his biggest concern is speed of cars on the street which he can hear at night. He stated he grew up in the city of Chicago and lived on a similar street and he and another child were hit by cars and stated he doesn't want anything to happen.

Public testimony was closed out.

Jill Juliano stated that after the January meeting, 14 letters about this petition were sent to the Village with 11 supporting the all-way stop signs and three opposed.

Commissioner Chesney asked if Keep Kids Alive Drive 25 signs were installed on Lombard and also asked about pedestrian crossing signs. Jill Juliano responded that the Keep Kids Alive Drive 25 signs are petitioned for and that pedestrian crossing signs are only on major streets.

Commissioner Eichenberger asked about the off-set intersection, geometry, and stop signs. Jill Juliano responded that no other off-set intersection has all-way stop signs.

Commissioner Patzloff stated that he believes due to the school, library, and park in close proximity there is a lot of pedestrian traffic and supports the installation of the all-way stop signs.

Commissioner Schoenmeyer stated he was concerned about the installation of stop signs initially but doesn't see another solution.

Commissioner Gillespie thinks Iowa and Harvey should be looked at for safe walking route. Jill Juliano stated Village of Oak Park, District 97, and a consultant worked on walking routes map.

Commissioner Schoenmeyer motioned to (1) Upgrade to all-way stop signs at Thomas St. and Lombard Ave. (2) Increase traffic enforcement (3) Review walking route for Thomas and Lombard and possibly modify it (4) Modify walking route pending District 97 approval (5) Construct ADA ramp on south leg of intersection and (6) Remove ADA ramp on NW quadrant. Commissioner Eichenberger seconded the motion. The vote was as follows:

Ayes: Gillespie, Eichenberger, Patzloff, Schoenmeyer, Chalabian, Chesney

Nays: None

The motion passed six to zero.

CONTINUE DISCUSSION REGARDING DEVELOPING A TRAFFIC CALMING TOOLBOX

Mike Koperniak, Traffic Safety Engineer of the Engineering Division of the Public Works Department, gave a presentation that continues the discussion regarding developing a traffic calming toolbox. Mike began the presentation by speaking about the previous

meeting and looking at sets of criteria to determine if traffic calming is needed and if what tools would be most effective.

Mike reviewed the criteria of the City of Albuquerque and Prince George's county and their scoring systems and levels for measuring criteria. Commission should look non-physical and physical as well as levels for measuring criteria and determine what they would like to add into the Village's toolbox.

Chair Chalbian spoke about the differences between the two criteria and Oak Park and that he likes the scoring idea but doesn't want to take the emotion out of making decisions.

Commissioner Eichenberger asked if the toolbox would be available to the public at some point and Mike Koperniak answered that he thinks it would be after petitions are entered.

Chair Chalabian stated that this would be changing the petition process that has been in place for decades and spoke about the current petition process. He stated he thinks the public would be willing to participate more when the parameters are low. Chair Chalabian likes the idea because most times petitions are easy to get through but others are difficult especially when people are looking for help and are very emotional. He thinks the Commission should use scoring system and it should be easy enough so residents know how and when expectations will be met.

A discussion was had among the Commission and Mike Koperniak regarding east/west and north/south main arterial streets in regards to traffic calming, if the Commission was comfortable with the scoring system and discussing the point assignment system and criteria. The discussion continued about what criteria to measure, what to leave off, and the cost of various studies and budgeting for them in the future. The differences between the two model cities and Oak Park with them being large and the Village being smaller were included in the discussion. Some petition criteria will be straightforward but other situations like Lombard and Thomas will need flexibility.

Chair Chalabian stated he doesn't want to add too much criteria so the focus of the petition gets lost but also doesn't want just a few issues to be main focus of criteria. However, there must be a way to include Commission's input.

Commissioner Chesney stated its possible situations would meet criteria in three main categories and if not, measure by others. Mike Koperniak stated points are either given or not.

The Commission decided on the following items as measurable criteria for the traffic calming toolbox: Bike Routes, Community Support, Crashes, Pedestrian Traffic Generators, Speed, and Traffic Volume.

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Mike Koperniak stated he thinks this is a good start and can take Commissioner's in and customize to Oak Park's needs.

Commissioners stated next meetings in May would be on May 9th and May 23rd.

A motion was made by Commissioner Eichenberger and seconded by Commissioner Patzloff to adjourn the meeting.

The voice vote was unanimous to adjourn the meeting.

The meeting was adjourned at 9:10 PM.

DRAFT Transportation Commission Meeting Minutes Monday, May 9, 2016 Room 101 – Village Hall

Call to Order

Chair Jack Chalabian called the meeting to order at 7:01pm

Non-Agenda Public Comment

James Thompson of 1018 Wisconsin attended the meeting to determine if he would consider becoming a member.

Agenda Approval

Commissioner Patzloff moved to approve tonight's agenda. Commissioner Eichenberger seconded. The motion was approved by unanimous voice vote.

CONTINUED DISCUSSION REGARDING THE Y2, Y3, AND Y4 OVERNIGHT PERMIT PARKING ZONES STUDY Director Jill Velan gave a recap of last fall's meeting, the Commissioner's surveys, comments from neighbors, and staff reviews and recommendations. Ms. Velan spoke of the next steps: circulating the staff's recommendations to the public for input and conducting an on-line survey monkey, then returning with a final recommendation.

Tonight's meeting is to walk through the staff's recommendations for the Y2, Y3, and Y4 overnight permit parking zones. With the loss of the privately run YMCA 24 hour parking lot, the eventual redevelopment of overnight permit Lot 108 and 24 hour permit Lot 115, the zones are now selling out. Director Velan also stated that we cannot make up for all the lost 24 hour spaces but within the next couple years, there will be private parking offered at the new South Boulevard and Harlem development where permit lots 108 and 115 are located. These will help make up some of the losses.

Chairperson Chalabian inquired if residents who live south of Randolph have migrated to the Holley Court Garage and if there has been an uptick of 24 hour permits sold there. Director Velan responded that there has been an increase in 24 hour permits at Holley Court but since the YMCA was a private lot, it's not clear if the residents who used to park there have moved to Holley Court.

Chairperson Chalabian asked if there has been an increase of available permits for sale. Director Velan stated that the zones are selling out quicker and that the limit number of permits has not been increased. Y2, Y3, and Y4 could have gone half a quarter before selling out in the past. She also stated that the new Oasis Development may have new residents who have multiple vehicles inquiring about permit parking and that the current permit parkers at Lot 108 and Lot 115 will need to obtain new parking.

Commissioner Patzloff inquired about the agreement for parking with the new development at Harlem and South Boulevard. Director Velan answered that the agreement states the new development is

required to have a certain number of public spaces. The new development will also have accommodate for resident, hourly, and retail parking spaces. Commissioner Eichenberger asked if staff will make parking availability known at the new garage to which Director Velan answered that they can be added to the Village's private spaces list.

Director Velan then began the PowerPoint presentation going through the commissioners' comments and staff recommendations of the Y2, Y3, and Y4 zones.

Director Velan described attached Map A— 100 block of S. Kenilworth— It was recommended that the overnight permit hours in Y2, Y3, and Y4 be standardized to 11pm-6am. Currently the hours vary by street and staff has to tell parkers to refer to the signs to know when the zone permit parking hours are. 11pm-6am works in Y1 but may need to be different in Y2, Y3, and Y4.

Chairperson Chalabian asked why there are 2 hour restrictions instead of No Parking 8am-10am. He points out enforcement has to chalk every 2 hours and it is expensive to enforce. Chairperson Chalabian then asks if it is to discourage commuter parking. He also noted the differences in daytime parking restrictions street to street. Commissioner Patzloff agreed that No Parking 8am-10am would be preferred and easier to enforce. Director Velan responded that there are multiple reasons for the difference in daytime restrictions, including resident petitions, and that it is not that easy to streamline No parking 8am-10am on all blocks. Employees of the local businesses who have shifts starting after 10am will utilize the blocks for free parking as has been the case with Pete's Fresh Market parking on Harvey, South Blvd, and Lake.

Chairperson Chalabian stated that No Parking 8am-10am costs a lot of money to maintain and enforce and is confusing to enforcement officers and residents. By adding the additional overnight zone permit spaces it will add an extra layer of confusion. He believes it's a moot point if the daytime restrictions remain the same. Director Velan indicated that staff will look at the time limits vs. time restrictions. She stated that it could be considered getting rid of the time limits and switch out No Parking 8am-10am for No Parking10am-12pm or No Parking 12pm-2pm. This could still discourage commuter parking and give the permit holders more time in the morning. Restrictions Coordinator Tina Brown states that the residents of the 100 block of S. Kenilworth petitioned for the 2 hour M-F restriction in 2005 and explained the reasoning why the change was made.

Chairperson Chalabian commented that Parking Enforcement Staff has been reduced by 50% and at the same time, there has been an increase of daytime parking restrictions. Commissioner Patzloff noted that since there is half the enforcement staff, it would be better to standardize the daytime restrictions. Commissioner Gillespie stated that it should vary block to block with the no parking hours. Director Velan responded that if we want no time limits then we'll have to see how it flows with the business district as well as reviewing resident daytime permit parking.

For Map A: Commissioners OK with additional overnight zone permit spaces.

Director Velan described attached Map B— 100 block of Clinton and Map C- 1000 block of Pleasant St. — Chairperson Chalabian asked about adding additional permit parking on South Boulevard and adding night permit parking to Lot 10. Engineer Koperniak noted that the street is too narrow for additional permit parking on South Blvd. Director Velan stated that Lot 10 is outside of the study but is on the list to review later.

Director Velan described attached over Map D – 1000 block Pleasant Pl. – Director Velan stated that additional permit parking street could include 24 hour street parking.

Chairperson Chalabian noted that Lot 81 across from the YMCA is confusing to both permit holders and people trying to park to go to the YMCA. He stated the parking to go to the YMCA is scarce and asked about adding additional meters on Randolph. Director Velan responded that the meters in that whole area should be looked at.

Director Velan described attached Map E – 400 block of Clinton

Went over Map F-800 of Randolph— 800-832 Randolph (south side) has 24+ spaces that are currently staff parking for Brooks Middle School which are never used and are otherwise unrestricted during the daytime. Chairperson Chalabian noted that No Parking 8am-10am M-F should be considered for the north side.

Director Velan described attached Map G – 1000 Randolph

Director Velan recapped the lease agreements with Brooks Middle School/District 97 and spoke about the Chase Bank contract being terminated by the bank. They have no interest in a new agreement.

Director Velan stated that staff cannot recommend adding permit parking on Madison in the Y2, Y3, and Y4 zones since it is a snow route and may be redeveloped. Chairperson Chalabian noted that permit spaces could be added on Madison for temporary relief and Commissioner Patzloff also stated it could be a stop gap. Director Velan explained that it is a business district and that night permit holders will want to stay longer which could reduce spaces for customers. Commissioner Gillespie noted that it would be weird to have permit holders in a commercial area.

Director Velan went over the possibility of approaching Rush and West Suburban hospitals to see if an agreement can be reached to add permit parking at their facilities.

Director Velan spoke of the road diet on Madison Street and noted that there would be no loss of parking. Block by block parking on Madison differs in daytime restrictions/meters.

Director Velan recapped the next steps including taking public comment and possible meetings to look at parking as a whole.

There being no further business to discuss, a motion was made by Commissioner Eichenberger and seconded by Commissioner Gillesipe to adjourn the meeting. The voice vote was unanimous to adjourn.

The meeting was adjourned at 8:57pm.

At its April 25, 2016 meeting, the Transportation Commission reviewed the criteria used by two communities to generate a score for streets and intersections that residents

have petitioned to have traffic calming measures implemented on.

The Commission voted unanimously to use the following six criteria in developing the Village of Oak Park's Neighborhood Traffic Management Program (NTMP).

Vehicle crashes

- Vehicle speeds
- Vehicle volumes
- Pedestrian generators
- Community support
- Bicycle routes
- Sight distance (recommended by Staff for intersections)

The purpose of tonight's discussion is two-fold; determine a score for each of the chosen criteria and develop formulas for generating those scores.

For tonight's meeting, Staff is presenting a summary the scoring system and formulas from eight communities from across the country. The complete NTMP report from each of these communities can be found in the Transportation Commission's FTP website.

Some questions to be answered while reviewing the scoring systems and formulas include:

 The scores from the eight commutes appear to be relative scores by which the community can compare one petitioned for street versus another. Should the Village develop a base standard score for a "normal" street by which to compare petitioned for streets to? Petition scores falling at or below this base standard score would not be processed further.

- 2. It appears that the scoring for most of the communities does not distinguish between street mid-block traffic calming and street intersection traffic calming. Should the Village's scoring system distinguish between the two and use two different scoring systems?
- 3. Seven of the eight communities include crash, speed, and volume scores. Some weigh each of the three equally while others weigh them differently. Which approach should the Village use?
- 4. What points should the Village use for each criteria in its scoring system?
- 5. Speed limits are typically set at the five mile per hour increment either below or above the 85th percentile speed. It could thus be argued that there in not a speeding problem if the 85th percentile speed is at or below the next higher five mile per hour increment. Some communities assign a score if the 85th percentile speed is at least one mile per hour above the posted speed limit while other communities assign a score only if the 85th percentile speed is at least five miles above the posted speed limit. Which approach should the Village consider?
- 6. Should the Village use the scoring system and formulas from one of the eight communities, or mix and match from amongst the communities, or develop its own unique scoring and formula system?

It appears from reading through the eight NTMP reports that many of the communities use a two tiered system. The lower level utilizes easier to implement and less costly traffic calming measures while the upper level utilizes harder to implement and more costly traffic calming measures.

The next step after the Village's scoring and formulas have been developed is to consider if the Village should use a two tiered system.

AA. ORD 16-038

An Ordinance Amending Chapter 2 ("Administration"), Article 12 ("Madison Street Coalition") of the Oak Park Village Code

Village Manager Pavlicek stated that subsequent to the creation of the Madison Street Coalition, the Village Board has made changes to the zoning on Madison Street as well as reconstituting the mechanisms of the Oak Park Economic Development Corporation. Because those actions have created a conflict with the ordinance that created that commission, staff has put forth amendments to the code to re-establish the Madison Street Coalition and provide for new appointments that would sunset upon the expiration of the Madison TIF on December 31, 2018.

<u>Chris Donovan.</u> Mr. Donovan spoke about a Freedom of Information Act request he submitted regarding the Madison Street Coalition.

Village President Abu-Taleb noted that he would like the Ordinance amended to reflect that the focus of the work of the commission is pursuant to the Madison Street TIF Redevelopment Plan and Project and the Madison Street Corridor Plan.

It was moved by Village Trustee Tucker, seconded by Village Trustee Button Ott, that this Ordinance be adopted as amended. The motion was approved. The roll call on the vote was as follows:
